HYDRANT FLUSHING:

The Wernersville Municipal Authority will be Flushing Fire Hydrants through the system during the Month of April.

THE FIRST TWO WEEKS THEY WILL BE FLUSHING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF PENN AVE.

THE SECOND TWO WEEKS THEY WILL BE FLUSHING THE NORTH SIDE OF PENN AVE.

Flushing will generally be conducted between the hours of 7 am and 3 pm. The schedule may change due to operational challenges. If changes to the schedule are made, WMA will make every effort to update our website and the Wernersville Borough as soon as we know a change will be made.

When hydrant flushing occurs you may notice slightly discolored water. If this happens, run your cold water tap for three to five minutes. If the water is still discolored, wait about 30 minutes and run the water again.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER

- **Trash Day is EVERY Thursday Morning!** If a holiday falls on or before a trash day, pick-up will be the following day. The affected Holidays will be Memorial Day (5/25), and Labor Day (9/7). Due to these holidays, Trash will be picked up on Fridays during those weeks.
- **Recycling Day is EVERY Thursday Morning!** Recycling will be collected on Friday if a Holiday falls in that week. Due to Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day, Recycling will be picked up on Fridays during those weeks.
- **Election Day** is May 19th at the Borough Hall.
- **Street Sweeping** will occur the weeks of April 13 and April 20, Weather Permitting. Please watch for signs.
- **Wernersville Annual Yard Sale:** will be Saturday May 16th and Sunday May 17th.
- **Memorial Day Parade:** Monday, May 25th at 10am (starting and ending at the Western Berks Fire Department).
- **Flag Day Ceremony:** @ the Heidelberg Heritage Society Lerch Tavern, Sunday, June 14th at 7pm. Bring your old flags and lawn chairs.

KEEP RECYCLING SUCCESSFUL-SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING

YES: White envelopes, computer paper, brown grocery bags, magazines & catalogs, chipboard/box board, white & colored ledger paper, newspaper, notebook paper, paper egg cartons, construction paper, soft covered workbooks, telephone & paperback books, junk mail, Juice boxes, milk cartons, aluminum cans, tin & bi Metallic containers: (including aerosol cans), milk/juice containers, aluminum foil (pie plates, eg), plastic containers 1-7, frozen food cartons.

NO: GLASS, Trash, diapers, clothing, styrofoam, bags, caps, lids, food, compost, yard waste, paper towels, mirrors, window glass, light bulbs, propane tanks, medical waste, Styrofoam peanuts.
Reminder: NO PLASTIC BAGS.

****Please Note:** If any of these items are put out with your recycling, the hauler will not take your recycling.

LIQUIDS must be emptied from bottles and cans before they are placed into the recycling bin.

WHO MUST COMPLY? All Businesses and residents in the Borough must comply. Each calendar year, Businesses and residential properties not included in the Borough's collection program, are required to report how much you recycle and where the materials were marketed.

BINS: please make sure that if you are not using the bin provided by the Borough (Black with Yellow lid), you must mark your bin RECYLING. The Borough Office has recycling stickers if needed.



TRASH COLLECTION: Pick-up is every Thursday. If a Holiday falls on a weekday on or before Trash and/or recycling pick up, pick-up will be the following day. The holidays that may affect trash pick-up are Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day.

LIMIT: up to Two (2) 64 Gallon containers per home, per week

If you have a large bulk item, you must CALL Casella at 570-305-2125 or 570-305-2127 to schedule a bulk item pick up, at an additional charge.

Please be sure to BAG cat litter and dog/animal waste before placing it in your container.

RECYCLING COLLECTION: Pick up is every Thursday. Recycling will be collected on Friday if a Holiday falls in that week. The holidays that may affect pick-up are Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day.

Please remember there is NO glass in recycling and NO plastic bags. Recyclable materials should be rinsed out before being placed in bins.

The recycling bin provided (Black with Yellow lid) is ONLY for recycling. If trash is placed in the recycling bin, it will not be picked up.



Keep Trees Trimmed

Please keep trees in your front yard and in the shade tree space (between the sidewalk and street) trimmed so that they are not hanging down over the sidewalk and street. Trees must be trimmed to no less than 7 feet about sidewalk and no less than 15 feet above the street. Please make sure that you are keeping your sidewalks clear of any tree limbs, bushes, brush, debris and weeds etc. so that they are safe for pedestrians. If you have any bushes or trees close to the sidewalk, please make sure they are trimmed.

WEEDS: Please make sure you keep your sidewalks and curbs weed free. It is the responsibility of the resident/homeowner to maintain the sidewalk and pull or spray weeds along the curb.

Yard waste can be taken to South Heidelberg drop off. The gates are open 7AM-8PM (April 1 through October 31) and 7AM-6PM (November 1 through March 31).

Directions: go past the Moyer Nissan building, take the first left onto Point Road. Drop-off is to the right.

****Please Note:** will need an access card to use the Yard Waste Drop off Site**

Contact South Heidelberg Township at 610-678-9652 or go on their Webpage to complete and print the application for an access card.

*****Please be kind to Workers and Pedestrians*****

Keep tree limbs, trash cans and cars off of the sidewalk and curb.

DO NOT blow cut grass out into the street. It is a safety hazard and harmful to the environment.

Curbside Yard Waste Collection will be on Monday, June 15th. YOU MUST call the Borough office at 610-678-1486 to SCHEDULE your pick-up by June 12th. Place items out the night before, we will be picking up early. Yard waste (limbs, branches, shrub trimmings, etc.) should be tied and properly bundled, maximum size 48"X18"X18" will be collected. Trimmings should be properly tied or placed in an open container. NO TRIMMINGS IN PLASTIC BAGS AND ABSOLUTELY NO GRASS WILL BE COLLECTED.

Flag Drop Box: There is a Flag box for your old/damaged American Flags at the Borough Hall. The Borough Hall is open Mon-Fri 9am-2pm.

Gun Permits: Gun permits can be obtained every 3rd Wednesday of the month at the Borough Hall from 9am to 3pm. ****Please note, you must register online with the Sheriff's office for an appointment****



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR HOME OWNERS:

HOME ADDRESS: All home addresses should be easily visible from the street in case of emergency.

SELLING YOUR HOME? The Wernersville Borough requires an inspection prior to making settlement on the sale of a home in the Borough, under Ordinance 545. Please contact us for the form and fee for this inspection. All homes must also have Sidewalk and Curbing, under Ordinance 530. If they do not have sidewalk and curb prior to the sale, it would need to be installed by the new buyer within 120 days after settlement.

ELECTRONIC WASTE COLLECTION: The Solid Waste Authority has an electronic-waste collection center located at 1316 Hilltop Rd., Leesport. The center is open Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 8AM to 12 noon. They accept all electronic items, TV (limit 2), VCR, microwave, air conditioners, and fluorescent light bulbs, etc. This is free for all residents. There is a fee for businesses and an appointment is needed. Call 610-478-6362 if you need more information.

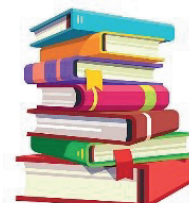

ORDINANCES TO KNOW:

DOG ORDINANCE - An ordinance is enforced in the Borough that dogs must be on a leash, muzzle, and/or similar restraining device; or in an enclosure from which they cannot escape. Also, dogs are NOT allowed in any of the Borough Parks.

ANIMAL WASTE ORDINANCE - Animal owners must clean up animal waste and dispose of properly in a sealed bag or container and deposit in trash receptacle.

DOG LICENSES - All dogs in Berks County must have a license. To obtain a license contact the County of Berks.

WEED REMOVAL ORDINANCE - Requires all grass, weeds, and other vegetation, in excess of 6 inches to be cut. The owner of any rental or vacant property shall carry out the same requirements.

PORTABLE BASKETBALL NET ORDINANCE - These are not allowed to be placed on the planting strip overhanging into the street or placed in the street.

FIRE PITS/OPEN BURNING - Fire pits are permissible if they are being used for cooking food. No Open burning of items such as furniture, recyclables, or yard waste, etc. is permitted.

TRAILERS - No Trailer, whether attached to or not attached to a vehicle, shall be parked, or stored on any Borough Street for a continuous period exceeding 24 hours.

COMMERCIAL VEHICLES - No commercial vehicle with a Gross weight of 10,000 pounds or more shall be parked on a Borough street for more than one (1) hour. This includes Tow Trucks, car carriers and low boy trailers.

NOISE ORDINANCE - Excessive levels of noise (ie: construction, music, yelling/shouting, television, dogs barking, etc) are prohibited between the hours of 10pm and 7am.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE ORDINANCE -

A. Where properties abut a public right of way, the property owner is responsible for the maintenance of the area between their property line and the street. This includes the curb, curb face and connection seam of the curb and street surface, for removal of weeds, grass and other plant material.

B. Registered Motor Vehicles are prohibited from parking on any non-paved area in the front of side yard of a property. Registered motor vehicles may be parked on non-paved areas in the rear yard if the property has solid fence with a minimum height of 6 foot tall fence around the rear yard.

REMINDER from the Tax Collector:

Please make sure your Tax Bill Number is on your check! If you are using Bill Pay make sure you give your Bill #.

*The Tax Collector will be at the Borough Hall to collect Taxes on the following days from 10am - 12pm:

April 21, April 22, April 23, April 28, April 29 and April 30.

****REMINDER:** The Tax collector will NO LONGER be in the office on a regular basis, as she retired from her position in the Office in December. If you would like a receipt, you can either come during her sitting hours or drop off BOTH copies of your tax bill and payment with a self addressed stamped envelope.



From the Codes Department: Just a friendly reminder.....

All fences, sheds, decks, patios and the like require, at a minimum, a zoning permit prior to construction or installation.

Also, as the warmer weather approaches, you may think about relief from the heat in the form of a swimming pool. Please be aware, that all swimming pools, whether in-ground, temporary or permanent, that are designed to hold 24 inches or more of water must comply with zoning and building codes. All swimming pools that are designed to hold 24 inches or more of water have specific electrical and barrier (safety) requirements through the state building code. A zoning and building permit is required prior to the installation and use of those swimming pools holding 24 or more inches of water.

Additionally, the Borough enforces the 2006 International Property Maintenance Code as the regulation for the maintenance of properties and building within the Borough. This code includes but is not limited to, the maintenance of buildings such as peeling paint, structural members, roofing materials etc. The code also regulates the appearance of properties related to the outdoor storage of materials or debris that are not designed to be stored outside. This includes rubbish, garbage, and cars in disrepair on the property that are not registered, inspected or licensed.

Grass and weeds must be trimmed to less than 6 inches high.

Also, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to fix their sidewalks or curbs if they are in disrepair.

Please be advised that the Borough may begin actively patrolling for property maintenance violations. If you see something that may be in violation of the property maintenance code, feel free to file a complaint with the Borough Office by calling us at 610-678-1486.

NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES)

What is NPDES?

The NPDES permit program addresses water pollution by regulating point sources that discharge pollutants to waters of the United States.

Created in 1972 by the Clean Water Act, the NPDES permit program is authorized to state governments by EPA to perform many permitting, administrative, and enforcement aspects of the program.

Actions YOU can Take at Home:

Prevent Chemical Pollution: Never dump oil, paint, or household chemicals down storm drains, on the street, or into ditches.

Manage Yard Waste: Compost or bag grass clippings and leaves; never wash them into the street.

Pet Waste Management: Pick up pet waste, which contains bacteria and nutrients that pollute water.

Car Maintenance: Wash cars at commercial car washes (which treat the water) or on grass, not on driveways, to prevent soap and grease from entering storm drains.

Fertilizer Use: Follow manufacturer instructions, and do not apply fertilizer before rain.

WESTERN BERKS FIRE DEPARTMENT

Spring is a busy and exciting time for the members of the **Western Berks Fire Department** as our communities come back to life after the winter months. With warmer weather and longer days, more residents are spending time outdoors, working in their yards, and enjoying everything our area has to offer.

Over the winter, our firefighters remained active responding to emergencies while also dedicating many hours to training. Recently, members completed ice rescue training conducted over multiple sessions and worked alongside neighboring departments to sharpen critical lifesaving skills. Training like this ensures that when an emergency happens—whether it's on the roadway, at home, or on local waterways such as **Blue Marsh Lake**—our firefighters are ready to respond.

As spring arrives, it's also a great time for residents to take a few simple steps to keep their homes and families safe. Checking smoke alarms, replacing batteries if needed, and reviewing your home escape plan are quick actions that can make a big difference in an emergency. If you plan to do outdoor burning, please remember to follow local regulations and always keep a water source nearby.

We are proud to serve this community and remain grateful for the continued support of our residents and municipal partners. That support allows the Western Berks Fire Department to continue training, responding, and providing the level of service our communities deserve.

COMMUNITY SAFETY Reminder : E-Scooters and the Law

As spring weather encourages outdoor activity, we are seeing a marked increase in electric scooter (e-scooter) use across the Boroughs and Townships. While these are a popular and convenient mode of transportation, their rise has unfortunately led to a number of safety concerns and reported “close calls.”

Important Legal Clarification

A critical point of confusion is that e-scooters are not legally treated as bicycles. Under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, the majority of e-scooters are categorized as “motor-driven cycles.”

Because they lack necessary safety equipment (such as turn signals and mirrors) for state inspection and registration, it is illegal to operate them on public roadways or sidewalks.

SHPD Approach: Education First!!

To ensure community safety, our officers will focus on educating the public this spring. If we observe a scooter in use, we will stop the rider to discuss the following safety guidelines:

- **Public Use Restriction:** E-scooters are limited to private property. Operating them on public streets or sidewalks is both unsafe and unlawful.
- **Single Rider Rule:** These devices are engineered for one person. Carrying a passenger compromises balance and drastically increases braking distance.
- **Recommended Safety Gear:** We strongly advise all riders to use helmets and wear high-visibility clothing.

Enforcement and Consequences:

While our initial goal is accident prevention through education, reckless operation or the creation of a public hazard may necessitate more serious enforcement actions, including:

1. Issuing Traffic Citations or Disorderly Conduct citations.
2. Confiscation of the device in extreme or repeated violation cases.








For additional clarification on street regulations, please review the attached information, which was recently updated by PennDOT in February 2026.

If you need to report an e-scooter being driven on the roadway, please contact Berks County Non-Emergency at 610-655-4911. Your prompt call is essential for a timely response and resolution of the incident.
